Homework Guidelines

Homework is the best way possible to prepare for the exams by actually working problems as we go along. I want as much as possible to give you the maximum homework points possible. To be sure you receive as many points as possible for every homework, please do ALL of the following:

1. Show all of your work on each problem and circle your final answer. If the problem has multiple parts (a,b,c, etc.) be sure to show your work on each part.
2. Organize your work neatly so that I can read it and see how you got your answers. Not only will you receive more points on the homework, this will prepare you for the exams. I try to give lots of partial credit on exams IF I can see how you miscalculated--if I can't figure it out because you left out steps or your computations are a mess, I simply won't be able to give you partial credit.
3. On each homework please include: Your **Name**, the **Class** (e.g. Psy 216, T-Th 10:30-11:15 a.m. and the **Homework Number** with the **Problem Set** listed (e.g. HW 3: Chpt 2, Probs 3,4, 8, & 11). Note: For most of the assignments I will give you, the assignment is already printed off for you in a PDF file that can be downloaded from the course web site. In this case, just staple this assignment sheet to the front of your homework and write your name, class section, on the assignment sheet.
4. Please **staple** your pages together before you get to class.
